WELCOMING REV. GABRIEL SALGUERO



The Rev. Dr. Gabriel Salguero is the president and founder of the National Latino Evangelical Coalition, a coalition of Hispanic evangelical churches and non-profits committed to Gospel-centered advocacy. He has served on the White House Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships Advisory Council and the board of the National Association of Evangelicals. He is a pastor at Calvario City Church, a multicultural church of about 4,000 people in Orlando, Florida and a former pastor of the Lamb's Church of the Nazarene in NYC.

Named by The Huffington Post as one of the most influential Latino faith leaders in America, Salguero offers an important voice for the growing diversity and changing demographics in the United States. Salguero is a regular contributor to the religion pages of Washington Post, Huffington Post, and Time magazine, where his writings focus on poverty, immigration, and education.
