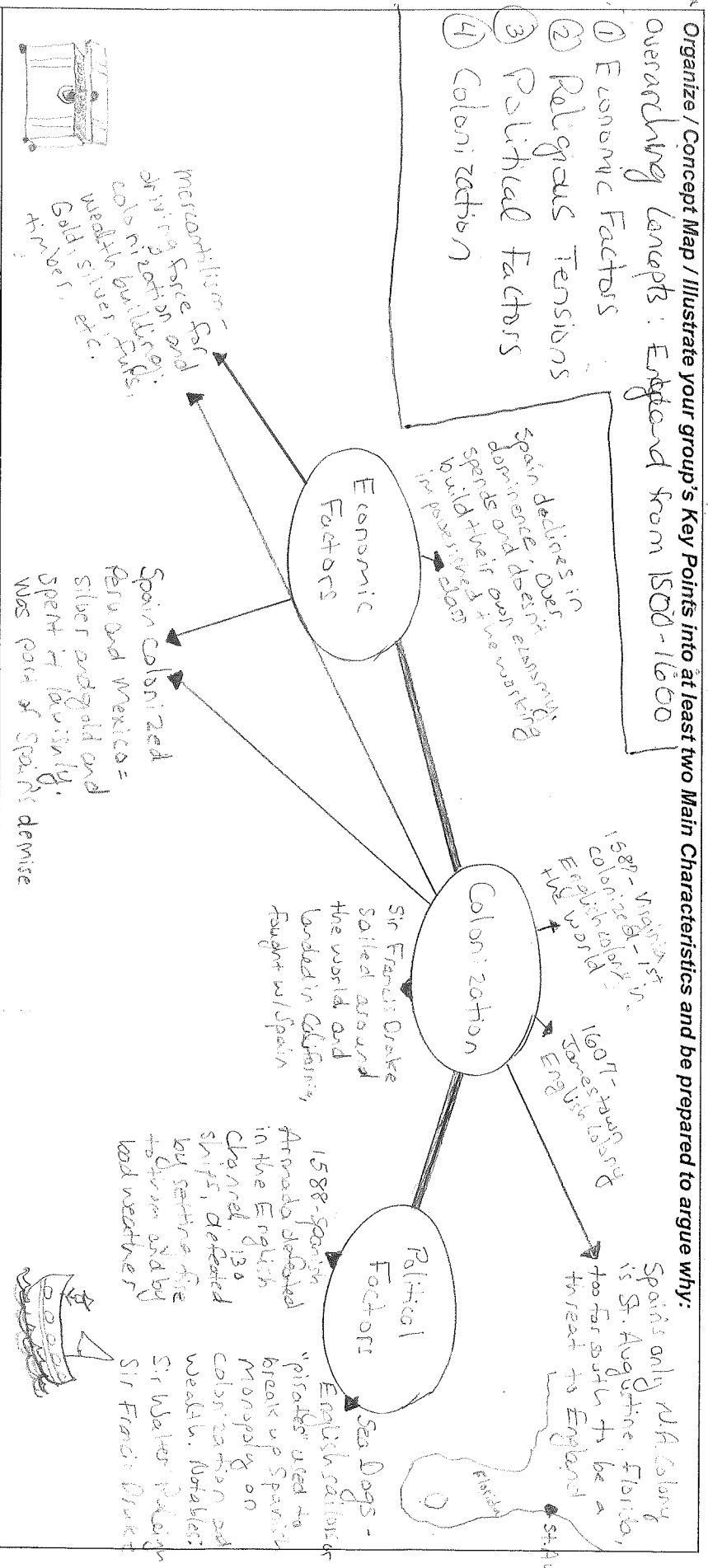

Sea Dogs	pg. 22	- English sailors employed by Queen Elizabeth to "chip away" at King Philip II of Spain's "monopoly" on the wealth and colony-building in the New World - Famous sea Dogs: Sir Walter Raleigh and Sir Francis Drake - Drake sailed around the world
1588	pg. 23	- Spanish armada - 130 ships sailed in the English channel. Spanish armada was powerful but 'clunky' with many different types of ships. - unsuccessful due to setting fire to the ships (by British) and due to bad weather
Virginia	pg. 22	- named by Sir Walter Raleigh as the first colony in the New World by England in 1587 - Established colony site at Roanoke, first English child born in New World - Virginia Dare. Colony disappeared.
